LOBBY/INTAKE

A well-designed lobby and intake area is essential to the smooth operation of a correctional facility. The seating and tables used in this space must be able to maintain high durability levels and easy cleanability while simultaneously contributing to the overall aesthetic of the space.

SAFETY AND SECURITY

Utilizing open sightlines and designating clear paths allows for security members to efficiently address any potential safety or security concerns. The furniture situated in these areas must be highly durable and offer easy cleanability to combat heavy traffic and the heightened probability of encountering willful abuse.



VISITATION

Visitation areas can play a key role in improving the mental health of inmates by providing a sense of normalcy and social connection with their loved ones. In turn, this can result in reduced tension and conflict within the facility.

NATURAL LIGHTING

Natural color hues can help create a calming atmosphere that reduces stress and anxiety, thus creating a safer and more secure environment with reduced risk of violent outbursts.

TAMPER RESISTANCE
